This guide helps you apply what we're learning at Lakepointe to your weekly rhythms. Use it to engage in daily Bible reading, have meaningful conversations with your group, and take clear next steps in following Jesus.

WEEKLY SUMMARY

The goal of a disciple is to look and live like Jesus. This week, we look at how Jesus shows us the heart of God: He goes after ONE MORE. He leaves the ninety-nine to pursue one lost sheep. He searches the house for one lost coin. He runs down the road to embrace one lost son. Jesus was never obsessed with crowds—He was moved by individuals. Every name matters. Every story matters. Every soul matters. Disciples of Jesus carry this same urgency and compassion. We are not called to build something big; we are called to faithfully pursue the ONE person God has placed near us. At Lakepointe, this is not about reaching thousands—it's about every disciple reaching ONE MORE for Jesus Christ.

GROUP DISCUSSION

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:

- What stood out to you this week in your daily Bible reading?
- From the story of the lost sheep, lost coin, and lost son in **Luke 15**, what do you notice about the heart of God? Who has God used in your story to pursue you, pointing you to Jesus?
- Review **Jonah 3-4**. Where do you feel hesitation or resistance when it comes to reaching out to certain people? What truth about God's mercy or character can you claim to help realign your heart with God's?
- Read **Matthew 28:16-20**. How does the Great Commission connect with the stories in Luke 15? Who might be your ONE MORE this season?
- Read **Romans 10:14-15**. What responsibility does this place on us as disciples? What practical step could you take to help someone move one step closer to Jesus?
- Have you identified a ONE MORE in your life? What is one intentional action you can take this week toward your ONE MORE?
- What is one step of obedience you want to take this week? Discuss the weekly challenge below.

WEEKLY CHALLENGE

Identify a ONE MORE in your life. This is someone closest to you who is farthest from God. Write this person's name on a card and put it somewhere you will see it regularly. Begin praying for this person. Ask God to give you an opportunity to invite your ONE MORE to Easter service.

GROUP PRAYER GUIDE

Invite your group to get in groups of 2-3 to pray:

One More - Pray for each other and everyone's ONE MORE. Ask God to give each other an opportunity to B.L.E.S.S. (see Podcast notes for explanation) your ONE MORE.

Marriage Weekend (Feb 21/22) - Pray for each other's marriages. Pray for the marriages of everyone who will be in service next weekend. Pray for God to strengthen relationships and protect them against division by the Enemy.

God's Heart for the Lost (Luke 15)

Luke 15 opens with sinners drawing near to Jesus while religious leaders complain. Jesus answers with three escalating stories:

- 1 lost sheep (out of 99) - 1 lost coin (out of 10) - 1 lost son (out of 2)

Big idea: God relentlessly pursues the lost—whether they're lost through:

- Neglect (sheep) - Circumstance (coin) - Rebellion (son)

No matter why someone is lost, Jesus still comes after them.

The Father Runs Toward Prodigals

The prodigal expected rejection, but the Father ran first: grace before condemnation.

- Jewish villages could perform a Kezazah ceremony (public rejection).
- The Father races to restore his son fully:
 - Robe = righteousness, Ring = family authority, Sandals = sonship, not slavery, Feast = salvation celebrated

Warning: Both sons were lost—one in immorality, one in self-righteousness.

Proximity to God ≠ intimacy with God.

Reaching “One More” Is the Mission

Lakepointe's goal isn't numbers—it's faithfulness: every disciple reaching one more.

- Evangelism isn't “close the deal in one conversation.” Evangelism is a team sport.
- Think in steps: 10 → 0 (salvation)
- Your role is often: 6 → 5, not 6 → 0

A Simple Framework: B.L.E.S.S.

A practical rhythm for reaching people far from God:

- B — Begin with Prayer (the battle is spiritual)
- L — Listen Deeply (go three questions deep)
- E — Eat Together (relationships change before beliefs)
- S — Serve (love tangibly)
- S — Share (don't hide your faith)

Does the Bible Teach Predestination?

Yes—predestination is a Bible doctrine, not a “Calvinist thing.”

Key passages:

- Ephesians 1:4-5
- Romans 8:29-30
- Acts 13:48

Cultural Discernment: Christian First

- The real question is: Is my Christianity shaping my worldview?
- We can critique culture with conviction while remembering: God’s heart is still for lost sons and daughters.
- Even with God’s sovereignty, Scripture commands us to: preach, pray, pursue, invite.
- Our job is obedience. God’s job is salvation.
